And, at the General Leadership meetings this December, we were finally able to sign an agreement for the

sale of several parcels of land adjacent to Pio XII School. This has been a 30-year effort by various leadership groups with several potential buyers. But all the pieces this time came together with an international company, Tegra, that hopes to build several apartment buildings on the land. It will still take a number of years to complete the project, but it is on its way forward.




And, the children and their families also remembered to give thanks on this special day, as they created turkeys with wings of all they are thankful for.
